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

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Nursery

This week in Nursery we have been reading 'Supertato Veggies Assemble', which is about a superhero potato, who protects all the other vegetables from 'Evil Pea'. The children have made their own Supertatoes, helped find and record how many vegetables Evil Pea had hidden and told their own Supertato stories, using real vegetables. We have also made our own superhero board game, which the children have enjoyed playing this week. They decided on what shape to make the board, carefully cut out all the pieces to make the game and helped to come up with the rules.



Reception

Evil Pea has continued to cause mayhem in Jeffers Class this week. We have been reading Supertato: Veggies Assemble this week. The children created their own Superhero vegetables to help Supertato capture the Evil Pea. We also investigated the properties of water and ice: freeing frozen vegetables and watching ice melt.

In Phonics we have been revising the sounds: k, l, r and u. We have practised listening for these sounds in words and learning to write them using our pre-cursive letters. Please look for these letters when you are 'out and about'. See if your child can find them in signs, car number plates, packaging etc.



Most children now have one of our reading scheme books to practise their reading and blending at home. Please remember to read 'little and often' with your child. We are working hard with those children still learning to blend, and aim for them all to have reading books within the next few weeks.

In Maths we have been learning the numeral and value of numbers 6, 7, and 8. Please practise counting at every opportunity and finding these numerals while 'out and about', e.g. bus numbers, house numbers, car number plates, price tags in shops etc.

Please note:

The end of the school day can be very hectic. In order to ensure communication between school and home remains effective, we are going to trial a new system.

If a teacher needs to speak with you about your child's day, your child's name will be written on the blackboard next to our Reception door. Please check this board each afternoon when collecting your child. Many thanks.
