Nursery

This week in Donaldson class we have been focussing on our bodies. At the beginning of the week, we read *Funny Bones* by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. After reading, we discussed where we find skeletons, the role they play in supporting our bodies and the names and location of key body parts.

The children enjoyed painting skeletons, singing various action songs, playing games linked to naming and identifying body parts and playing *Go Lungs Go* – exploring breathing by blowing cotton wool balls from one end of the line to the other. In maths we have explored length and used cubes to measure our feet and compare who has the longest versus shortest feet.

In phonics we have been focusing on listening and remembering environmental sounds.

During Forest school they continued with an Autumn theme as they created a leaf mobile and immersed themselves in the season of Autumn.


They have been exploring settings through our book The Snail and the Whale. They chose their favourite and wrote about why the particular setting appealed.
