


NEWSLETTER 30th September 2022

Nursery

What a fun week we've had! Last Friday we went on a welly walk searching for signs of autumn and collected different coloured, shaped and sized leaves; horse chestnuts; acorns and sticks to use for activities this week. The weather was awful - pouring with rain, we found the largest puddle we could and had great fun jumping in it - we all got very wet! The children observed the drop in temperature, the changing colour of leaves and leaves starting to fall. They were excited to find a horse chestnut and most cautiously touched the spikes. At the beginning of this week, we read the beautifully illustrated texts *Leaf Man* by Lois Elhert and *Goodbye Summer, Hello Autumn* by Kenard Pak which we used to inspire our own autumnal artwork. On Wednesday the children enjoyed their first Forest School session. Mrs Maclean our Forest School teacher talked to us about the how to keep ourselves and our friends safe and gave the children a tour of the Forest School. Afterwards the children enjoyed climbing, swinging on the nope swing and tyre swing, swinging on the hammock and swinging their friends on the hammock. They also enjoyed digging and building bridges. A great morning.

In phonics we have focussed on environmental sounds and tuning into sounds. In maths we have focussed on number recognition, counting and reciting numbers to 5. The children have enjoyed numerous other activities this week including daily Dough Disco and Squiggle Whilst You Wriggle sessions (helping to develop their motor skills). Reception

Reception has had a busy week with lots of lovely new learning. This week we have been speaking about our families and have discussed all the special things we can do with our families.

We have enjoyed learning new phonics sounds through the *Letterland* fast track scheme. Each day we have briefly reviewed two letter sounds, learnt actions, and listened to a story to help us remember the sound of the letter. Our Reception students are beginning to hear the initial sounds in different words. Very soon we will begin using these sounds to read unfamiliar words.

The highlight of our week was attending Forest School. The children had a fantastic time digging, climbing, swinging, and playing in the woodland. Students were also encouraged to find different shaped leaves and look on a chart to find out which tree they came from.

Our focus book this week is Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers. Children have been writing their own packing list of the things they would take with them on a journey to the South Pole.





Year 1 Dahl:

As we are reading The Snail and the Whale, we went exploring the habitat around the school. Look what we found. We also did leaf rubbings for our wall display and the children were amazed to see the leaf appear as they rubbed over it. I do encourage you to explore the habitat around your home. I am so happy to finally be in England. I am getting to know all the wonderful children in Dahl class and look forward to a year of learning and fun.





Year 2 Browne:

During our' Zones of Regulation' lesson this week, we had enormous enjoyment playing BINGO for the first time. Both Mrs Tutt and I were so impressed with Year 2's understanding of all the colours associated to 'How We Feel' and were able to link this with previous learning displayed on our learning walls. Not only were children able to identify a specific zone but also could write down the exact emotion linked with each clue. WELL DONE EVERYONE!

Walliams really enjoyed their whole-class jam as they practiced their musical skills in their ukulele session.



Walliams learned how to communicate appropriately whilst messaging and produced wonderful writing and fantastic artwork which are featured in the Key Stage 2 Hall.






Year 4 Snicket:








Year 6 Shakespeare:
