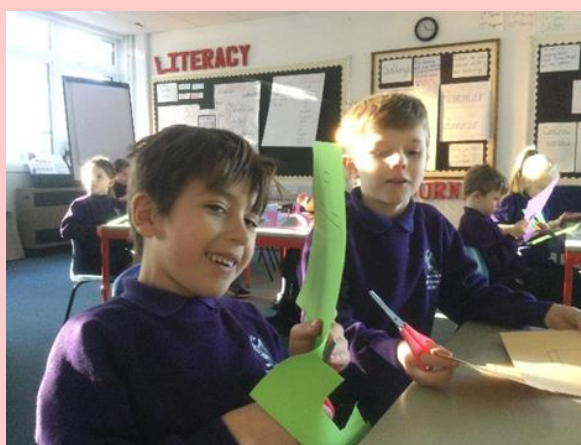
Year 1: Dahl

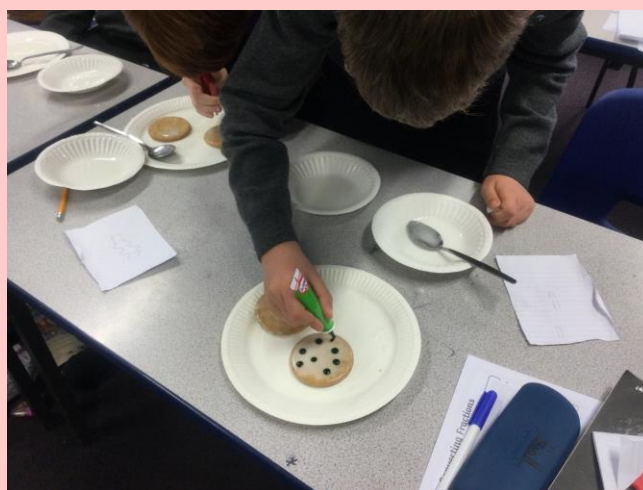
Year 5 Blake

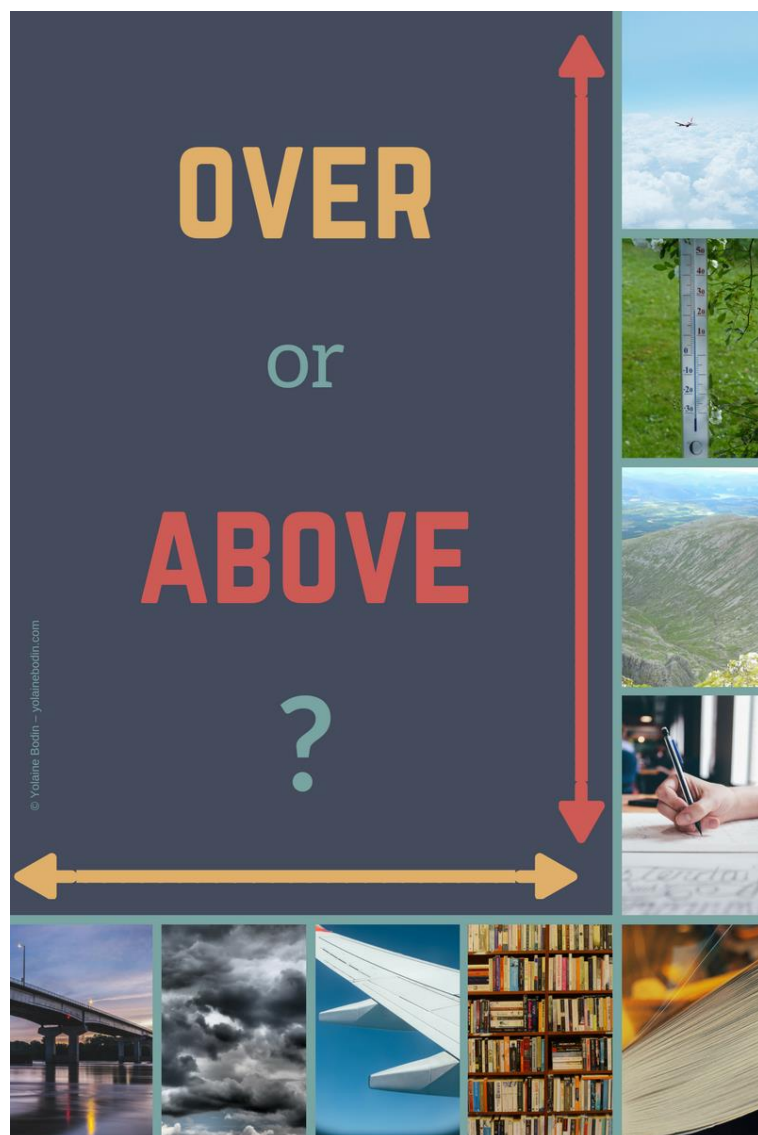
