Early Years Foundation Stage


This week in Jeffers class we have been busy preparing for our Mother's Day Tea Party. We have been learning songs and talking about why our mothers are special to us. We are very excited to share this with you next Tuesday, 14th March.

In phonics we have been practising reading and spelling words adjacent consonants +s (as in the word swim) and s+ (as in the word best). The children have been applying their growing knowledge of adjacent consonants to their reading and spelling.

In maths the children have enjoyed playing bingo with numbers 1-10 and ordering numerals to 10. In PE the children are continuing to focus on ball skills – they had lots of fun practising throwing and catching within goals. They are continuing to apply their growing ball skills during child-initiated learning time. During wet play on Thursday the children had great fun playing parachute games.









Year 1: Dahl

Dahl class have been thoroughly enjoying their book 'The Lonely Beast'. They created their own story sequence bunting. The children have also been learning about Geography linked to mountains, a river, the park and the sea that are featured. After they explored the layout of school, they took an imaginary walk through the area they live in to spot and describe the features they see.










Year 2: Browne

During Art this week, Year 2 have been learning all about 'Pop Art'. They have researched various famous 'Pop Art' artists like Roy Lichenstein and have been studying a range of different/exciting techniques to create their own masterpieces. All children have enjoyed participating in a range of different activities allowing them to showcase their OUTSTANDING outcomes. Well done everyone!





Year 3 Walliams:

The children conducted an investigation to measure friction created by different surfaces. They took careful measurements in a controlled test.



Jackson C also created a wonderful model of a Viking longship. He painstakingly fixed a surface of wood pieces to serve as planks and painted the sail beautifully.

Year 4 Snicket:

Year 4 wrapped up warm and enjoyed Forest School this week. They made potions in the mud kitchen, swung on the tyre swing and attempted to cross a muddy puddle on the rope swing!






Year 5 Blake:

In science, Year 5 carried out an experiment to investigate how oxygen affects fire.

The children made their prediction before lighting candles and covering them with glasses of varying sizes. They then timed how long it took each flame to go out and recorded the results. Everyone really enjoyed the experiment!

Year 6 have overcome the challenges of the week and showed great focus on finding percentages amounts. They have begun to consider and plan their own Mexican folktales in literacy. Primary School Applications

Applications for transfer to primary school for both the Reception year and Year 3 (junior school) in September 2023 will open on Friday 4 November 2022 and close on Monday 16 January 2023.

Summer-born children

As you may be aware, while most children start school in the September following their 4th birthday, they do not reach Compulsory School Age (CSA) until the term after their 5th birthday. For children who are under CSA, once a place has been accepted, parents/guardians can decide for their child to start a pattern of part time attendance or a delayed start until later in the school year.

DOB	May start school full or part time from	Must start school full time no later than
1 st Sept 2018 – 31 st Dec 2018	September 2023	January 2024
1 st Jan 2019 – 31 st Mar 2019	September 2023	April 2024 (Usually following the Easter Holidays)
1 st Apr 2019 – 31 st Aug 2019 (also known as a Summer Born child)	September 2023	September 2024 (starting from Year 1)

If you think this arrangement may apply to you, please use the Parental <u>advice</u> from the Department of Education to help you make a decision.
