Reception: Jeffers

Jeffers have had a fun-filled week.

In phonics they have been practising reading and spelling words with adjacent consonants and final consonant blends and have learnt the digraph (two letters that make one sound) **th** (as in then and thick). They have also been practising reading tricky words. In addition to continuing to explore the pairs of numbers that make 10, our main focus in maths this week has been 3D shapes. The children went on a 3D shape hunt and had great fun rolling 3D shapes down a ramp – exploring which shapes roll and which don't and discussing reasons why, focussing on each shape's properties.





Year 1: Dahl

Despite cold and rainy weather, Dahl class had a wonderful time at the park. The children were looking to see if they could spot their friend, the Lonely Beast from their class story. Leyton was convinced he saw him! Year 1 were able to identify many geographical features that have been studied during Geography and the children ascribed outstanding adjectives to their descriptions.

A tasty picnic was enjoyed on imaginary grass (our classroom carpet) and then the children sketched what had been identified during the visit. We think this picture captures the wonder of the day beautifully.

In DT this week, Year 4 have enjoyed planning, building and testing boats made of tin foil. Most of the boats were able to hold 50 marbles!






Year 5 & 6: Blake and Shakespeare

Applications for transfer to primary school for both the Reception year and Year 3 (junior school) in September 2023 will open on Friday 4 November 2022 and close on Monday 16 January 2023.

Summer-born children

As you may be aware, while most children start school in the September following their 4th birthday, they do not reach Compulsory School Age (CSA) until the term after their 5th birthday. For children who are under CSA, once a place has been accepted, parents/guardians can decide for their child to start a pattern of part time attendance or a delayed start until later in the school year.

DOB	May start school full or part time from	Must start school full time no later than
1st Sept 2018 – 31st Dec 2018	September 2023	January 2024
1 st Jan 2019 – 31 st Mar 2019	September 2023	April 2024 (Usually following the Easter Holidays)
1 st Apr 2019 – 31 st Aug 2019 (also known as a Summer Born child)	September 2023	September 2024 (starting from Year 1)

If you think this arrangement may apply to you, please use the Parental <u>advice</u> from the Department of Education to help you make a decision.
