Early Years Foundation Stage

This week has been full of excitement and fun. On Monday, we were visited by Jaws 'n' Claws - the children learnt lots of interesting facts and all had the opportunity to hold and stroke the animals (bar the tarantula!). They met Madagascan Hissing Cockroaches, a Bearded Dragon, Giant African Snails, Giant African Millipedes, Australian Tree Frogs, a Cane Toad, a Red Footed Tortoise, and a Royal Python. The children have completed their innovations of what The Very Hungry Caterpillar ate, updated their sunflower diaries, and completed their own sequence of the lifecycle of a butterfly – we are very impressed with their recollection of the lifecycle and the key words - chrysalis and pupa, in addition to their understanding that it takes approximately two weeks from transformation of chrysalis to fully fledged butterfly. Our very own caterpillars have transformed into chrysalises - the children have been observing their transformation with great glee – we so hope they get to see their final transformation to adults (butterflies)!

In maths the children have practiced solving addition and subtraction problems to 10. In phonics they have been introduced to two new digraphs this week, the split digraph i-e (as in tide) and the digraph ee/(as in seed), and the alternative pronunciation for the y phoneme – long e sound when added to the end of a word (as in baby); they are also continuing to practise recalling all tricky words taught to date.

We have sent home the sunflowers the children planted at the beginning of this term – please share photos of the different stages they go through on Tapestry (i.e., bud, bloom). We would love to see how tall they get – you could send a photo comparing their height/growth to your child's.















Year 1: Dahl

The children in Dahl class have been creating descriptive sentences and questions relating to their beautiful book, The bee who Spoke. They have been encouraged to use adjectives to make their sentences sparkle. During Science lessons the children created a crown to show the life cycle of a bee and the warmer weather has allowed them to go outside to play games to practise our prepositional vocabulary in Maths.

Excellent work, Dahl class.









Year 2: Anthony & Browne

During Science, Year 2 created the perfect environment within the classroom where they've seen our sunflowers grow from a tiny seed to a living breathing plant. We would like the children to look after these during half term. Please could they water them regularly, keep them in sunlight, and if possible, measure the plants to see how tall they have grown. We would like the Sunflowers returned on the first day back to school so we can monitor their growth during our final term. Well done Browne Class!











Year 3: Walliams

Year 3 enjoyed Forest School this week. Here are some boys with a handful of newts. They have learned to tell the difference between the palmate newt and the smooth newts, as well as spot males and females. Year 3 have also enjoyed a funfilled ukelele lesson.

Year 4 had a wonderful time pond dipping and climbing trees in Forest School this week.







Year 5: Blake

Year 5 have been exploring the artwork of William Morris this term. The children were each given a sponge, which they cut various shapes out of. They then used the sponge pieces to create their own repeated pattern inspired by his designs. They have also sketched several of their own nature themed designs and will choose their favourite to recreate with paint.





Year 6: Shakespeare

Year 6 have had a strong and enjoyable end to term. They were thrilled to receive their Leavers' Hoodies and insisted on wearing them despite the sunny weather! We were also very proud of their efforts in writing this week and we look forward to celebrating their final term with them at Temple Grove.








Forest School
